

FTS Recommended IP Phones



Softphone:

For just \$39 you can extend the mobility of your FTS PBX system to your desktop computer at home, or even your laptop while on the road. **Note:** For quality reasons we do **not** recommend that a softphone ever replace a hardphone for an employee. Consider it a 2nd "on the road" phone.

Pros: Work on your laptop. Make and receive calls anywhere there is a broadband connection.
Cons: Voice quality is not as good as a hard phone.



BudgeTone 201: Retail \$59 or Lease for \$6/month

The BudgeTone 201 is FTS's least-expensive hard phone option. Perfect for back offices, hallways, wiring closets, or anywhere else that is reasonably low-traffic and needs only simple connectivity. The BudgeTone 200 offers a standard feature set giving you all the functionality you would need for simple connectivity.

Pros: Our Most Economical Phone.
Cons: No Caller-ID Name. No On-hook dash dialing. No PoE. No call logs. Poor Speakerphone.



GXP-280: Retail \$79 or Lease for \$8/month

The GXP-280 is a great entry level phone for businesses on a tight budget. Ideal for small offices. Despite its low-cost, the GXP-280 offers several upgraded features usually reserved for more expensive phones. The GXP-280 is great for businesses that make few calls.

Pros: Easy to use. Great price. Good for SOHO offices.
Cons: Average Speakerphone.



GXP2000: Retail \$99 or Lease for \$10/month

The GXP2000 is a great phone for businesses on a tight budget who want the look and feel of a front-office or managerial phone. Despite its low-cost, the GXP2000 offers several upgraded features usually reserved for more expensive phones. One 10/100 Ethernet port allows you to share one connection for both your phone and computer.

Pros: Multi-line. Easy to use. Expandable for operator. Good for call center. PoE.
Cons: Average Speakerphone.



GXP-2010: Retail \$129 or Lease for \$12/month

The GXP-2010 is suited for managers and executives who want more features than the average phone. With 4 lines and 18 programmable keys you have plenty of room for multiple speed dial settings. 11 dedicated keys create one-button access to indispensable telephony features including hold, conference, mute, do-no-disturb, intercom, transfer, speaker and voicemail. Dual ethernet port.

Pros: Good value. Large LCD. Expandable for operator. Good speakerphone. Nice executive phone. PoE
Cons: Few programmable buttons



GXP-2020: Retail \$149 or Lease for \$15/month

The GXP-2020 is the big brother of the GXP-2010 and comes with all of the features of the 2010, **plus** multiple line appearances/lights, BLF and a 10/100 Ethernet bridge allowing you to share one Ethernet connection for both your phone and computer.

Pros: Amazing value. Easy to use. Large LCD. Lots of features. PoE
Cons: Few speed dial buttons.

Cisco 7960: Retail \$369 or Lease for \$39/month

The Cisco 7960, featured in many movies and television shows, comes with industry accolades. This phone supports 6 lines, has a large LCD graphical display, and features 2 programmable keys, 4 dynamic soft keys, and 24 polyphonic ringers.

Pros: Namebrand. High Quality. Large LCD.

Cons: Pricy. No on-hook dial. No paging/intercom.



Polycom IP 560: Retail \$229 or Lease for \$25/month

The Polycom 560 is the upgrade to the Polycom 501 phone. It has all the features of the 501 plus a back-lit graphical display, an attractive aluminum-etched bezel, and a deeper boom improving an already great Polycom speakerphone.

Pros: Gigabit Ethernet. Great speakerphone. Large, backlit LCD.

Cons: Pricy.



Polycom IP 650: Retail \$299 or Lease for \$30/month

The Polycom 650 is a great executive phone. With support for 24 call appearances, a large back-lit graphical display, an attractive aluminum-etched bezel, and a deeper boom improving an already great Polycom speakerphone, this is surely a commanding phone on any desk.

Pros: Great speakerphone. Large, back-lit LCD screen. Executive presence.

Cons: Pricy.



Polycom IP 6000: Retail \$659 or Lease for \$70/month

Designed for offices or small to medium sized conference rooms, the SoundStation IP 6000 provides remarkable room coverage. You can speak naturally from up to 10-feet away from a microphone and still be heard clearly on the far end of the call.

Pros: Great for conference rooms.

Cons: Small LCD screen. Quiet ringer.



GXV3140-Multimedia Video Phone: Retail \$259 or Lease for \$25/month

The GXV3140 combines best-in-class technology to enable video and voice calling worldwide with just one simple step. A full-duplex speakerphone and popular voice codec support ensure best-in-class telephony features. Access real time information through an integrated web browser, RSS feeds of weather/news/stocks and internet radio.

Pros: Great for simple Video calling. Listen to streaming radio. Good all round Multimedia Phone.

Cons: Requires the other party to have similar phone for Video calls.
